58th Annual Conference of the American Association for Chinese Studies

Institutional Host and Conference Venue: Pepperdine University

October 7-9, 2016

The American Association for Chinese Studies (AACCS) annual conference program committee invites proposals for panels, roundtables, and papers concerning China, Hong Kong, Taiwan, and the Chinese diaspora for the 58th Annual Conference, hosted by Pepperdine University from October 7-9, 2016. The AACCS seeks to construct a balanced program, including panels representing the humanities, social sciences, communication studies, education, and business-related disciplines.

The AACCS is an interdisciplinary association devoted to the study of China broadly defined (<http://aacs.cuny.cuny.edu/homepage.htm>). Submissions from all disciplines are welcome. Membership in AACCS is required for participation in the annual conference, and non-members are welcome to submit proposals, join the Association and participate in the annual conference. We encourage submissions from graduate students, junior and senior scholars, and overseas participants.

The program committee prefers proposals for complete panels (a chair, 2-3 papers, and a discussant) and roundtables (a chair and 3-4 other participants). The committee also welcomes proposals for individual papers and will attempt to place them on appropriate panels. Panels and roundtables concerning special events or topics of broad significance are welcome.

The program committee consists of Program Chair Daniel Palm (Azusa Pacific University), Linda Chiang (Azusa Pacific University), and Hans Stockton (University of St. Thomas). The local arrangements chair at Pepperdine University is Joel Fetzer. Proposals should include the names and roles of panel/roundtable participants, contact information, paper topics and short abstracts (not to exceed 250 words). Please send your proposal by e-mail to the program chair, Daniel Palm at dpalm@apu.edu. Include complete contact information (address, telephone number, and e-mail) for all participants. The deadline for **panel and individual proposals is March 1, 2016**. Scholars submitting proposals by the deadline will be notified of their inclusion in the program by May 30, 2016.

The AACCS views panelist registration and attendance as a serious professional obligation. Panelists must register for the AACCS 2015 conference before **September 07, 2016** or be excluded from the printed program.
